This house is built of tree trunks! Step inside it and look around. What is your house made of?



Do you like to eat butter on your toast? If you lived here in the 1700s, you would have to milk the cow, skim the cream, and then make your own butter with the tool shown in this picture. Do you know this tool's name?



Can you find the school room at Historic Brattonsville? If you were a student in 1840, you would write your assignments with a quill pen and ink like this. What do you think a quill pen is made from?



Can you find this tool? People used it to spin sheep's wool into yarn, for making clothing. Do you know any fairy tales about this tool?
